**Atlantic Coast Line Depot**

The depot was built in 1903 and housed passenger and freight services. Part of the building was a waiting room. In the center of the building was a telegrapher's office.

The original Water Tower is a standing water pipe and was constructed in 1912.



**The Jesup Post Office / The Kicklighter Building**

The Kicklighter Building was constructed in the early 1890s. Kicklighter's daughter married a local dentist who threw extracted teeth into a hole in the wall.

The small white building on the left side served as the Post Office until a new one was constructed in the 1936.

This original structure once housed the Cohen Mercantile Store that was owned by Jesup Mayor S.E. Cohen and the Jesup Cigar Company owned by Jesup Businessman Harry W. Whaley.

During The Prohibition, the building accommodated the hiding of alcohol.
